Finding an Internship	Students find their own internship with TPC guidance at the beginning of the program, using their network of approximately 800 sites and evaluations from past TPC interns.	Students write internship request statement, related essay and resume, and 3 internship options are found for them. Students have phone interviews with the 3.	Internships are arranged by CP staff who contact students prior to semester to start the process. Over 350 sites possible. Locations are typically confirmed by first week or two of program.
Housing	Students learn to find own apartment with TPC guidance	Apartments are assigned	Apartments are assigned in 2 - 3 neighborhoods
